**BILL NO. 35-0178**

**Thirty-Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands**

**October 18, 2023**

An Act amending title 5 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 314, to add a section 3732a to allow for the automatic expungement of arrest records upon a finding that the arrest lacked probable cause and amending title 3 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 33, section 881(g), item 9 relating to public records to designate expunged criminal records as confidential records

- 1       **WHEREAS**, when an individual is arrested, and no probable cause is found a criminal  
2 record remains that negatively impacts the wrongfully arrested individual;
- 3       **WHEREAS**, Virgin Islands law presently requires the filing of a petition with the  
4 Superior Court of the Virgin Islands to obtain an expungement of an arrest record even if no  
5 probable cause was found;
- 6       **WHEREAS**, the filing of an expungement petition requires the impacted individual to  
7 spend money and other resources and to be subjected to a civil process;
- 8       **WHEREAS**, the automatic expungement of arrest records for which there was no  
9 probable cause for the arrest significantly reduces the impact of the arrest on the individual  
10 without subjecting the individual to a civil process or expense; Now, Therefore,

1 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Virgin Islands:*

2 **SECTION 1.** Title 5 Virgin Islands Code, subtitle 3, Part 1, chapter 314, is amended by  
3 adding section 3732a to read as follows:

4 “§ 3732a. Automatic expungement when no probable cause is found

5 When the Court finds no probable cause, the Court shall simultaneously enter an order  
6 expunging the arrest record, including fingerprints, mugshots, DNA samples, and any other  
7 police or judicial proceeding records of a person.

8 **SECTION 2.** Title 3 Virgin Island Code, chapter 33, section 881(g), item 9 is amended  
9 after “public records” by inserting “unless such records have been expunged pursuant to title  
10 5, chapter 314 of the Virgin Islands Code.

11 **BILL SUMMARY**

12 Section 1 of the bill amends title 5 Virgin Islands Code, chapter 314, to allow for the  
13 automatic expungement of arrest records that the Court dismisses for lack of probable cause.

14 Section 2 excludes expunged records from public access pursuant to 3 V.I.C. § 881(g),  
15 item 9.
